

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) is dedicated to fostering trust between communities, supporting durable solutions for displaced populations, promoting regular migration pathways and protecting people on the move. Collaborating closely with authorities and stakeholders, IOM helps to develop policies and enhance capacities in migration governance, focusing on international standards, labour mobility, integration, border governance, diaspora engagement for sustainable development and the protection of vulnerable migrants. IOM contributes to overall community stabilization and inter-ethnic dialogue, working with institutions, civil society, and various groups to address key drivers of migration and promote social cohesion.

Over 200 vulnerable migrants directly assisted through reintegration and psychological support, interpretation, information and institutional referral	VocUp platform, a tool to improve language skills, reached over 90,000 unique users, contributing as such to social cohesion
Supported authorities through continued capacity building for the development of a Roadmap for Labour Mobility and Regular Pathways	620 students and 33 teachers participated in trainings to ameliorate their emotional intelligence, analytical and complexity thinking
Partnered with the private sector to address current and future labour market needs while promoting fair and ethical recruitment	IOM supported the verification of 300+ diplomas, enhancing equitable access to education and employment for all ethnic communities
Supported regular migration pathways through outreach and awareness-raising to inform residents, including vulnerable populations, of their rights under the new EU visa-free scheme	Over 9,000 people benefited (directly/indirectly) from individual and community projects contributing to individuals' economic empowerment under the Community Stabilization Programme funded by the EU
Facilitated regular migration management through the interoperability and digitalisation of border governance systems	Fostered a multistakeholder whole-of-society and whole-of-government approach on migration governance
